

The United Nations Mission to Support the Hudaydah Agreement (UNMHA) has recorded one explosive ordnance (EO) related incident in Hudaydah Governorate, marking the lowest number of casualties since October 2021. This incident, which occurred in the Hays District, resulted in a total of three civilian casualties, including one woman who was injured. When compared to statistics from August of last year, this represents a notable decrease in the number of EO-related incidents, although some fluctuations with slightly higher numbers have been observed intermittently.

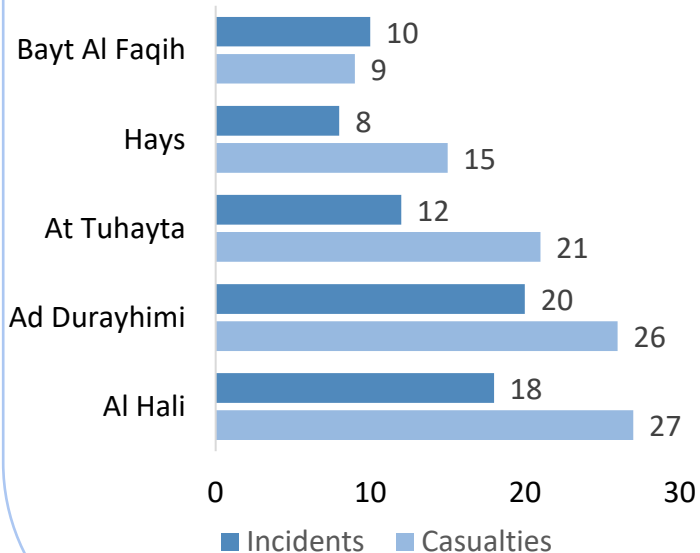

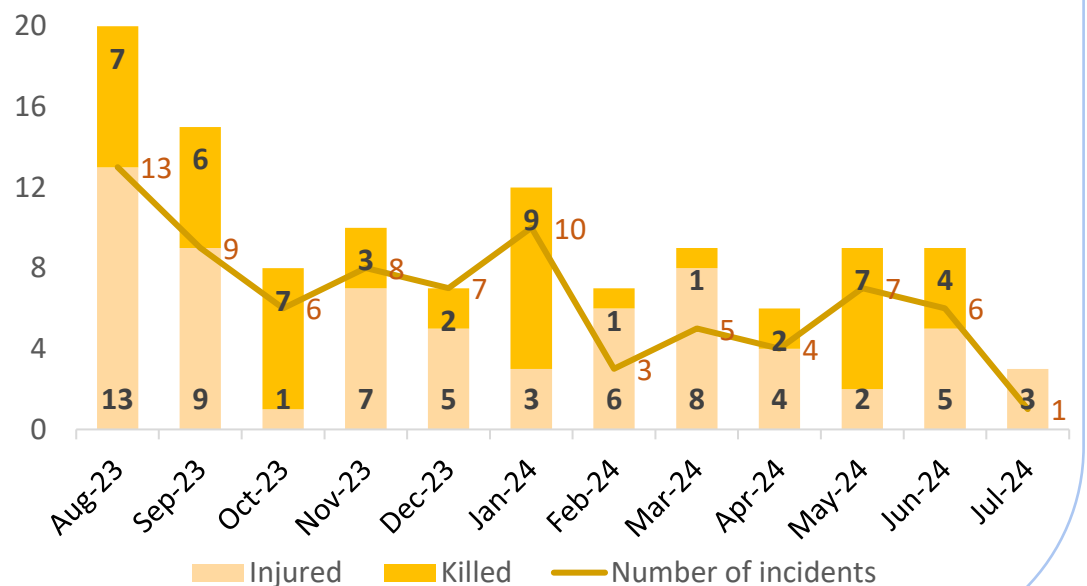

Number of incidents and casualties per month

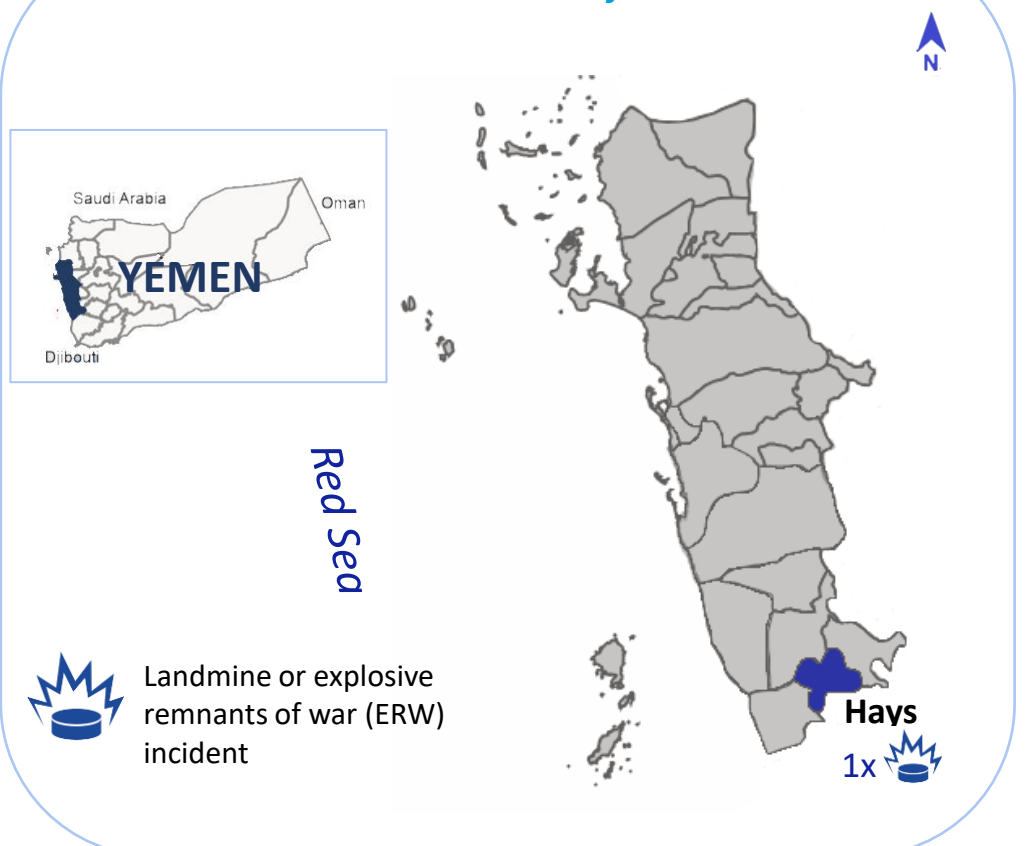



Mine Action Activities

In July 2024, the UNMHA Mine Action team carried out 19 activities, focusing on coordination meetings, technical support, and advocacy, particularly aimed at advancing mine action efforts in Hudaydah governorate.

A key event of the month was a workshop organized by the Yemen Mine Action Coordination Centre (YMACC) in Aden in cooperation with the Norwegian People's Aid (NPA) and the Resident Coordinator's Senior Mine Action Advisor as chair and co-chair of the Mine Action Area of Responsibility. The workshop focused on the review of the National Mine Action Standards (NMAS) and established specialized technical working groups tasked with revising and updating the NMAS to align with current operational realities. UNMHA actively contributed to these efforts.
