

- ✿ - Civil and regional war from 60's to 90's
- ✿ - The North Western regions bordering Thailand are contaminated by Landmines
- ✿ - Eastern regions are contaminated mostly by ERW
- ✿ - More than 2.75 millions tons of bomb were dropped from air plan during the regional conflicts




**Mine/UXO Accident by Provinces in Cambodia

-  - Regulation




All mine actions and plan

 - Promote Aid Effectiveness and the RGC's action Plan



- Provided medical supplies/treatment


